The Meh Factor and Epiphany

One of the fun things about being alive in this day and age is the way that slang words spread around the globe at lightspeed. Because of the internet, what was once a simple catch phrase amongst friends can become everyone's favorite expression in a week's time. One such word is "Meh."

Communicated like a sigh, Meh is simply an expression used to convey indifference to a subject or simply not caring. It's the verbal equivalent of shrugging your shoulders. It shows that the speaker is apathetic, uninterested, or indifferent to the question or subject at hand. It is occasionally used as an adjective, meaning something is mediocre or unremarkable. For example, someone asks you, "What do you want for dinner?" you can say "Meh," meaning "I don't really care." Or if someone asks, "Do you want to go to the mall?" you can say, "Meh, I have nothing to do today." The term has even made it to describe newsworthy events. On October 14, 2013 ABC News posted on their website: "US Government Shuts Down, World Says, Meh.""

If we're honest with ourselves, when it comes to our faith, we sometimes fall under the sway of what I call the "meh factor." Think about it. As Christians we have the awe-inspiring privilege of interacting with an infinitely pure and holy God who created everything from humanity to the tiniest sub-atomic particle. More than this, in Jesus Christ, this same infinitely pure and holy God became flesh to bare our sin away. Faced with such astounding news we often shrug it off with nothing more than a, "meh." For example, think about worship. Do you know that every Sunday we come together, God actually meets and serves us through Word and Sacrament? Amid such a staggering reality, we shrug our shoulders and think, "Meh, the last hymn went a bit long this week, I was late for brunch."

So, what's the remedy for the "meh factor?" In his book, "Your God is too Small," author J.B. Phillips writes:

Many men and women today are living, often with inner dissatisfaction, without any faith in God at all. This is not because they are particularly wicked or selfish... but because they have not found with their adult minds a God big enough... to command their highest admiration and respect, and consequently their willing co-operation.

In other words, to combat the "meh factor" in our hearts, we need a vision of God that is big enough to awaken us from our sloth, glorious enough to strike our hearts like lightning, almighty enough to make us uncomfortable with the way things are, and finally loving enough to move us from despair to worship.

This said, the season of Epiphany is the perfect time to encounter this God. Each one of our readings on Sunday Mornings are perfectly designed to laser focus our hearts on the dawning and awe-inspiring light of Jesus Christ. So, this Epiphany, spend some time in the Word.* While you're doing so, humbly ask God where you may have grown cold and indifferent toward him. Confess those areas and cling to Jesus for forgiveness. Finally, ask God to replace your "meh factor" with awe. Do that and see what happens.
